## Working with the Community

As you would expect, the children are our first priority but to provide the very best for them, we need to work closely not just with parents, but also the wider community. We need to help look after our environment and develop links with other schools and nurseries, sports clubs, health and social services, adult education and business and industry. We already do a lot but would like to do more.

### Eating

Now, encouraging children to develop healthy eating habits at an early age is as easy but very important. Recent research has shown that more and more children are unfit, overweight or even suffering heart conditions. This is also affecting their ability to learn.

Paisley is recognised as a leading school in trying to tackle this and has featured in the local media and on Radio 5 Live and Talk Radio, as well as Hull City Council videos and leaflets. We hope you are beginning to notice a growing understanding and change in attitudes towards healthy eating in your children and that you will gradually find it easier to achieve the same at home!

**Breakfast Club** – Free healthy breakfast for all children! Open every school day! No need to register, just turn up between 8am and 8:15. Very popular with working parents, this is a great way to make sure that the children get a good breakfast and also a chance to meet and talk or play with friends.

**Free Healthy Lunch** – All full-time children are now entitled to a free meal every day

We want the children to enjoy their PE and Games lessons and join in more active games at playtimes and lunchtimes. That is why we are spending more on developing the playground and on new equipment. It is important that children always have suitable PE and Games kit and are not allowed to miss lessons without very good reason.

We are also developing links with sports clubs and coaches, including Hull FC and Hull City, Grassroots Football and others to help us provide, or link with, more activities during the school day and afterwards. Some will be free, others will need a small charge to be made and your replies to our survey show many of you would pay 50p to £1 a session for such activities. New activities will continue to be developed.



## Community Recycling

**Glass, plastic, steel and aluminium, printer ink and toner cartridges**

Not only do we help our children to understand that it is important to look after our environment but we provide facilities for the local community. If you support these, you are not only helping to look after our planet, but also raising money for school through “green credits” and discounts on computer printer ink cartridges.
